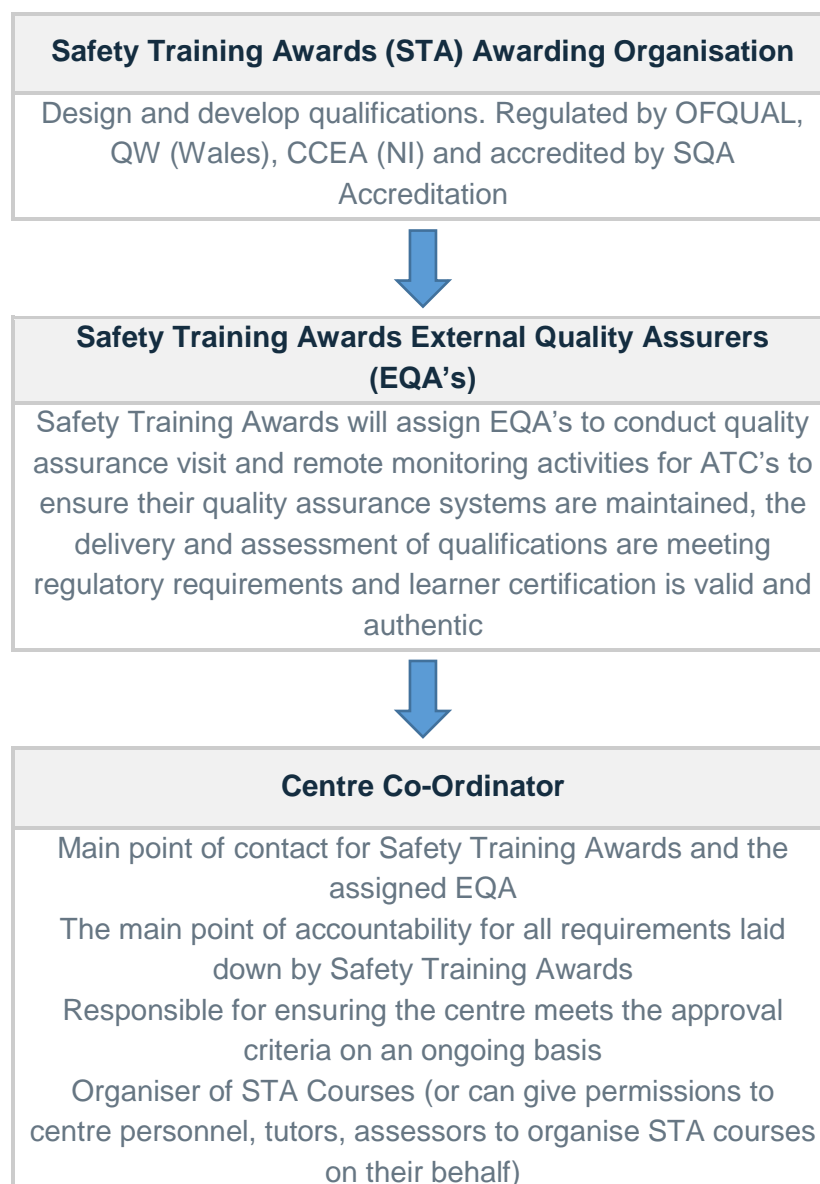
Definition of an Approved Training Centre (ATC)

Safety Training Awards defines a centre as any business or organisation who have the required resources and competence to deliver, tutor, assess and quality assure qualifications whilst meeting our approval criteria. This organisation could be an educational establishment such as a school or college, or a private training provider.

Roles and Responsibilities included within Safety Training Awards Quality Assurance and ATC Model

There are four roles which are fundamental to the success of the delivery, assessment and quality assurance of STA qualifications. Where permitted by Safety Training Awards, and in line with the conflict of interest policy some of these roles may be performed by the same person.

Approved Training Centre (ATC) Model





Internal Quality Assurer (IQA)

Monitor the delivery and assessment of qualifications through sampling learners' portfolios and interviews. Gather evidence to ensure the authenticity and validity of Safety Training Awards qualifications and to maintain learner and public confidence in the qualifications



STA Tutors / Assessors

Delivering and assessing Safety Training Awards qualifications, adhering to Safety Training Awards assessment criteria set out in the qualification specifications and meeting regulatory requirements
